ON EXHIBITION

Federation Council has resolved at its Ordinary Council meeting held on Tuesday 28 September, to place the Proposal to Reestablish Alcohol Free Zones and Alcohol Prohibited Zones on public exhibition for community feedback and input. The current Alcohol Free Zones and Alcohol Prohibited Zones are

due to expire December 2021. The proposal seeks to re-establish the existing zones for a further four (4) years until 1st December 2025 under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1993, following input from stakeholders and community engagement. Existing

zones, including maps are detailed in the proposal. No new zones have been included and no existing zones have been removed from this proposal. It is further proposed that a more detailed review of these zones and any potential new zones is undertaken by council in 2025.

Council is inviting the community to review the proposal and provide any feedback by **5pm Monday 1 November, 2021.** The proposal is available for viewing from Council's website or at
