MICROCHIP YOUR PET

Microchipping is a quick and harmless procedure where a small microchip is inserted between your pet's shoulder blades either by a local vet or animal welfare organisation. It provides identification only for your animal.

If your microchipped pet goes astray and is taken to a vet, pound or shelter, we use the microchip's data to contact you and quickly reunite you with your pet.

Microchipping your animal does not include registration. You must register your dog by 6 months and cats by 4 months of aqe

Our fury friends are so important in our lives, so make sure your pet is microchipped so if it does go astray we can return it safely to you.

COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM

Round one of the Federation Council 2021-2022 Community Grants Program is now open, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects, programs and events. Council is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organizations to apply for a share in \$60,000 of funding for this year's first round of Community Grants Program. Eligible applicants can apply under one of three categories:

- Category 1 Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.
- Category 2 Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
- Category 3 Community events grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events,

applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant. A new online easy to complete application form is now available from Council's website along with frequently asked questions and grant application tips.

SWOOPING BIRDS

Spring often signals the beginning of breeding season for our native birds, mainly Magpies and Plovers, which subsequently means swooping. During the nesting season, a Magpie may swoop on people,

clacking its beak. While alarming, it is usually an attempt to defend its family so just a warning. The good news is that a single Magpie will swoop for only six

weeks until their chicks leave the nest. Council has prepared a list of known swooping locations along with some safety tips to help protect you and your family. This information is available on Council's website. If you know of a hot spot swooping location, please let us know by completing the online form from Council's website.

HERBICIDE APPLICATION

A selective herbicide application will occur in September 2021 and early October 2021 to ovals, parks and open spaces throughout the Federation Council area. This process is to improve turf quality and reduce mowing frequencies. The herbicide that will be used is Javelin (20g/l Clopyralid, 15lg/I Diflufenican and 300g/I Mcpa)
