HOWLONG WATER MAIN UPGRADE WORKS UPDATE

Federation Council is undertaking the following water main upgrade works in Howlong between June and December 2023:

- 375mm diameter water rising main from Water Treatment Plant in Pearce St, to water tower in Townsend St. Route will be along Pearce St and Pell St;
- 375mm diameter water trunk main in Townsend St, from Victoria St to Jude St.
- 200mm diameter water main in Townsend St from Emily Ct to Kennedy St

Temporary road closures and traffic diversions will be in place at the above locations to ensure safety for residents, general traffic and contractor personnel. Affected residents will be notified prior to works proceeding. Every effort will be made to limit restrictions to access for residents to a minimum by:

- Providing alternate means of access if possible, or if not possible;
- Excavation and backfill across driveways intended to be done in the same day, and:
- Immediate removal of soil from trench excavation.
- Prompt installation of water main pip across driveway.
- Immediate backfull of pipe trench across driveway.
- Underebore road crossings for roads managed by NSW Dept of Transport.

We thank the Howlong community for their understanding and cooperation as Council continues to deliver projects such as this that build and create a safe and connected community.

Federation Council advises that there are significant delays to all applications being lodged for each stage of the development process. Staff shortages, in conjunction with the increasing complexity of the NSW Planning Portal Processes required to be undertaken by Council has seen pre-lodgement assessment times increasing to 6-8 weeks and average determination times taking between 10-12 weeks. We ask you for your cooperation as Council officers concentrate on clearing the backlog of applications while maintaining all other legislated services.

PLANNING REGULATIONS UPDATE

Federation Council wishes to advise that planning regulations have recently changed in regards to who can apply for a post consent certificate;

- Construction Certificate
- Final Occupation Certificate
- Subdivision works certificate

The Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021 prescribes that applications for Construction Certificates (CCs), Occupation Certificates (OCs) and Subdivision Works Certificates (SWCs) may only be made by a person who is eligible to appoint a principal certifier for the development. Council cannot accept applications for these Certificates unless the applicant is a person who is eligible to appoint a principal certifier for the development. Therefore, any application for these Certificates must be made by the owner/s of the land upon which the development will be carried out. When uploading an application for a Certificate to the NSW Planning Portal, the owner/s of the land must be shown on the prescribed form as the applicant/s for the Certificate. The owner can decide if they wish to have the application managed by a third party and provide their contact details as "care of" that third party (i.e. consultant, building firm, contractor, or the like).
