Polling booths will be open on Election Day, Saturday 14 September, 2024 from 8:00am – 6.00pm.

If you are voting in person you must vote at a venue in your enrolled council area. You cannot vote at a venue in another area.

If you are unable to cast your vote on Election Day you can cast a pre poll vote at Memorial Hall Corowa from Sunday, 7 September until Friday, 13 September or at the Council office in Urana from Wednesday, 11 September until Friday, 13 September. These locations offer Pre-Poll options only.

Federation Council's election will be administered by the NSW Electoral Commission and the election will be held on Saturday, 14 September 2024.

Corowa Art Space to Host the 2024 Bald Archy Prize

The Bald Archy Prize is returning to the Corowa Art Space for its 28th year. The Bald Archy Prize will be on display daily from Saturday 7th September until Sunday 6th October.

The Bald Archy prize was started by the late Peter Batey OAM in a corrugated iron shed at Coolac, just north of Gundagai in 1994, as a send-up of the prestigious portraiture award the Archibald Prize. The Bald Archy Prize celebrates the lighter side of art and the larrikin Australian spirit. Calling for paintings that include wit, slapstick, vulgarity, farce, black comedy, irreverence and everything in between, the prize pokes fun at Australians distinguished in art, letters, politics, sport or the media. The award continues to be judged by Professor Maude the Sulphur Crested Cockatoo whose eye for art matches her wicked wit.

With twice as many works as the previous year, 40 portraits will be on display at the Corowa Art Space. This year the exhibition features portraits of Australians and people of note such as Bob Katter, Jacinta Price and Scott Cam. The 2024 winner of the \$10,000 prize was awarded to artist Judy Nadin, for her work Flippin' Kerfection, a satirical caricature depicting Australian professional soccer player Sam Kerr OAM's iconic celebratory backflip in exaggerated action.

Also included in the exhibition is the work of Corowa's own Michael Mack, "I have three works entered and really enjoyed painting them. It's an opportunity to extend yourself and have a lot of fun. It would be great if other local artists submitted work next year. I'm looking forward to another great Bald Archy." Visitors will be able to hear all about Michael's creative process at his Artist Talk being held 11am on Wednesday 25th September.

Overgrown Vegetation

Spring is now upon us bringing weather conditions that promote abundant growth of grass, shrubs, weeds and other vegetation. As the fire restriction period is fast approaching, Council is encouraging your help to keep our community safe by ensuring properties are regularly maintained now and into the future.

Federation Council wishes to remind all landowners that they are responsible for keeping the vegetation within their property boundaries, fence lines and nature strips in good order. Council staff will undertake routine inspections over the coming months and will respond to resident concerns about excessive vegetation growth on properties.

To bring an issue to our attention, please lodge an online customer request from Council's website or contact our customer service team by phone.

Land reported to Council as having overgrown vegetation may be issued with an Order 21 in accordance with Section 124 of the Local Government Act 1993 and may be issued with a Penalty Notice.

Corowa, Howlong & Mulwala Flood Study

The draft Flood Study report is on public exhibition to Wednesday 11 September 2024. The Flood Study presents the results of detailed investigations into both Murray River and local runoff flooding conditions, focusing on impacts to the townships of Corowa, Howlong and Mulwala. Parts of Howlong are affected by local runoff flooding which includes Majors Creek flooding. Howlong is largely unaffected by Murray River flooding.
