RESPONSIBILITIES OF PET OWNERSHIP

Being a pet owner means there are responsibilities by law that are required to be adhered to.

Over the last few months, Council has received an increasing number of complaints in relation to aggressive dog behaviour and dogs escaping property and roaming the streets. To ensure the safety of your pet and the community, residents are reminded of some of the responsibilities of pet ownership to ensure your pet lives a full and happy life in our community:

- Provide a secure home environment so your dog cannot escape.
- Registration.
- Microchipping.
- Wearing a collar and identification tag with the name of the dog or cat, address or telephone number of the owner when in a public place.
- If you have moved residences, updating your contact details on your pet registration and microchipping records.
- When you take your dog to a public place they must be under the owners' effective control. This means on an adequate leash, chain or cord. If your dog is in an off leash area, it must be under your effective control.

Stray dog sightings should be reported to Council. If you find a stray or lost animal please contact Council and a ranger will collect the animal from you. During business hours, please call us or after hours complete our online customer request form: (add link to customer request form)

Federation Council advises that there are significant delays to all applications being lodged for each stage of the development process.
