

COUNCILLORS ENDORSE TO PROGRESS WORK ON SPECIAL RATE VARIATION PROJECT



Federation Council has resolved to endorse the progress of work required for an application to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) for a 69.94% permanent Special Rate Variation (SRV) over two years commencing 1 July 2025.

It is important to note that these increases effectively include the temporary 19% increase applied in 2023/24 and temporary 17% applied in 2024/25.

The motion put to Council's November Council meeting endorsed the updated 10 year Long Term Financial Plan to be placed on Council's website and public exhibition seeking community feedback for a period of 28 days. Council also adopted the recommended changes to the Delivery Program 2022-2026, and for the updated Delivery Program 2022-2026 to be placed on Council's website and public exhibition seeking community feedback for a period of 28 days.

Council resolved to continue to explore opportunities for financial initiatives through cost containment strategies, productivity improvements and revenue opportunities.

Federation Council has been on a financial improvement journey since it was formed in May 2016 from the merger of Corowa Shire Council and Urana Shire Council.

There has been community engagement on a future Special Rate Variation since mid 2021. Feedback from IPART in June 2023 detailed improvements that could be made to Council's community engagement around the proposed increase to general rates, with improvements since implemented. Comprehensive community engagement was undertaken in May 2024 and July 2024 on the need for the proposed SRV increase and the impact that it would have on ratepayers and the ability to renew assets that are important to the community.

2024-2025 YOUTH COUNCIL MAYOR & DEPUTY MAYOR ELECTED



The Federation Council Youth Council at its December meeting elected the 2024-2025 Youth Mayor and Youth Deputy Mayor for the term. Max Sampson has been elected as Youth Mayor and Dayna Carter, will continue as Deputy Youth Mayor.

Max who will be 13, when he serves his term, is passionate about the environment, jobs of the future, and young people being encouraged to do more with the arts.

Mayor Cheryl Cook, who joined the meeting as the Councillor delegate congratulated the Youth Council, "Participating in the Youth Council is a wonderful chance to provide input into our community's future. It is an important platform for young people to participate in local decision making and provides opportunities to take on leadership roles. I look forward to hearing what they have to say and seeing the outcomes of their work this year."

The Youth Council is a formal advisory committee of Council and is made up young people aged 12-25 from across the Council area. The Youth Council provides a voice for young people and advocates on their behalf on local issues, projects and initiatives. The Youth Council provides opportunities to participate in the community by organizing events, and working on projects that support and encourage young people.

Over the last twelve months the Youth Council have hosted the Halloween Party and Disco in Corowa, hosted an outdoor cinema in Oaklands, assisted with Youth Week activities in Mulwala and Rand, represented the Council at the 2023 Federation Australia Day Awards and Community Celebration, Hay Youth Summit and the 2024 Youth Conference in Sydney. Along with provided feedback Council's strategic documents including the Community Strategic Plan, Community Engagement Strategy, and the Child. Youth and Family Strategy. Members sat on the Council's John Foord Oval Facility Advisory Committee and Corowa Aquatic Centre Consultative Committee.





RESPONSIBILITIES OF PET OWNERS



Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals. Residents are reminded of the responsibilities of pet owners to ensure the safety of companion animals and the community.

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area.
- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Just like all breeds of dogs in NSW, greyhounds will still be required to be on a leash while in public at all times.
- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area.

- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Just like all breeds of dogs in NSW, greyhounds will still be required to be on a leash while in public at all times.
- A greyhound will still require a muzzle in an off-leash area if it has not undergone an approved retraining program. Greyhounds that have completed this program will continue to wear identifying green collars, or, alternatively the person in charge of the animal can carry a completion card.
- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
- Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, child care centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.

Relationships can be one factor in the formula of festive stress. It may be a difficult time because family and friends cannot be with you. Perhaps they live in a different country, state, or even city. If family is close by other factors may prevent spending the time together, such as difficulties in the relationship, illness, or inability to travel. 4. Plan fun things to do.

Family members are less likely to get into arguments if they are involved in activities such as board games or a cricket or soccer match in the backyard. Plan for something to do as a group and focus on things you enjoy doing together.

5. Take time out to spend with friends. Take time out to spend with friends during the holidays as well as family. Allow yourself a break from spending all your time in one place so that you don't feel overwhelmed or resentful.

6. Set aside time for yourself.

This can be something as simple as going for a short walk, or having a nap. Having some 'me' time helps to refocus and relax.

7. Look after your physical health.

Getting enough sleep, keeping up with your regular activity routine, using relaxation techniques, and eating and drinking with moderation will help give you the stamina to get through the demands of the season.

8. Set limits.

Set limits for the amount of time you will spend with family and friends, depending if you are travelling, or they are visiting you. This makes your time together special and more enjoyable.

9. Be grateful.

Be greatful that you have family and friends to share the holidays with. Appreciate the small things that other people do for you and reciprocate with gestures that show your appreciation for them. This takes away the negativity and replaces it with positive thoughts and actions.

10. Do something positive

If you are alone for the holidays do something positive for yourself. Cook a nice meal that you will enjoy, have a good book or movie to watch, go for a walk and if possible ring someone that you're not able to be with and catch up by phone or video. Consider volunteering so that you spend time with others and have a welcoming place to go.

"The First World War ended more than a century ago. The fighting stopped when an armistice between the Allied powers and Germany came into effect at 11 o'clock on the morning of 11th November 1918.

Millions had lost their lives during the war, among them more than 60,000 Australian service personnel, about one in five of those who served overseas. Many thousands more were wounded in body and mind. During the war and after its end, survivors returned home to a country both grateful for their service and traumatized by the war's enormous cost.

In time Australia's war memorials would come to honour the fallen of the Second World War and of the many other conflicts and operations in which Australians have served.

Today, the Australian War Memorial's Roll of Honour lists the names of over 103,000 Australians who have lost their lives in war and conflict.

As we pause today on this Remembrance Day, our thoughts turn to the war's enormous cost and the toll it took, not only on those who fell but on all who served".





A DIFFERENT VIEW OF CHRISTMAS

T'was the night before Christmas, he lived all alone in a one bedroom house made of plaster and stone. I had come down the chimney with presents to give, and to see just who in this home did live. I looked all about. A strange sight I did see; no tinsel, no presents, not even a tree.

No stocking by the mantle just boots filled with sand, on the wall hung pictures of far distant lands. With medals and badges, awards of all kinds, a sober thought came through my mind. For this house was different, it was dark and dreary. I found the home of a soldier, once I could see clearly.

The soldier lay sleeping silent, alone curled up on the floor in this one bedroom home. The face was so gentle the room in disorder. Not how I pictured an Australian soldier. Was this the hero of whom I'd just read? Curled up on a poncho the floor for a bed?

I realised the families that I saw that night, owed their lives to these soldiers who were willing to fight. Soon round the world the children would play and grownups would celebrate a bright Christmas Day. They all enjoyed freedom each month of the year because of the soldiers like the one lying here.

I couldn't help wonder how many lay alone on a cold Christmas Eve in a land far from home. The very thought brought a tear to my eye. I dropped to my knees and started to cry. The soldier awakened and I heard a rough voice, "Santa, don't cry, this life is my choice.

I fight for freedom, I don't ask for more. My life is my God, my Country, my Corps." The soldier rolled over and drifted to sleep. I couldn't control it, I continued to weep. I kept watch for hours, so silent, so still and we both shivered from the night's chill.

I did not want to leave on that cold dark night, his guardian of honour, so willing to fight. The soldier rolled over, with a voice so soft and pure, whispered, "Carry on Santa, it's Christmas Day, all is secure."

One look at my watch and I knew he was right. Merry Christmas my friend, and to all a goodnight.



URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.
