HARD WASTE COLLECTION - COUNCIL UPDATE

Council wishes to advise the community that at the August 2024 Council meeting, Council adopted its new Waste Management Strategy. The main intent of the strategy was to harmonize the waste services in both of the former council areas into one system.

A large component of the strategy development was to provide three bins to as many households as possible in the LGA and as has been provided in the Southern Area of the Federation region for the past 10 years. One of the other differences identified in the strategy development was that the Northern Area was provided with a hard waste collection service, and only one single refuse bin. In order to provide similar services throughout the municipality, the hard waste collection service has been discontinued to assist in harmonising our waste service delivery and funding the rollout of the new 3 bin service in the Northern Area of Federation Council.

All four Council operated landfills, including Urana and Oaklands, are still operative and will accept scrap metal for free. Other waste will attract their usual fees.

Council recognises that the hard waste collection service was well patronised, but has had to make a difficult decision to cease this service in the interests of fairness to all within residents the municipality.

OVERGROWN VEGETATION



Spring is now upon us bringing weather conditions that promote abundant growth of grass, shrubs, weeds and other vegetation. As the fire restriction period is fast approaching, Council is encouraging your help to keep our community safe by ensuring properties are regularly maintained now and into the future.

Federation Council wishes to remind all landowners that they are responsible for keeping the vegetation within their property boundaries, fence lines and nature strips in good order.

Overhanging or encroaching vegetation from private property onto footpaths can make moving around the neighborhood difficult for all pedestrians, particularly vision-impaired people, people with disability, wheelchair, and mobility scooter users, or parents pushing a pram. It can also reduce the area people can safely walk on the footpath, and restrict access.

Council staff will undertake routine inspections over the coming months and will respond to resident concerns about excessive vegetation growth on properties.

OAKLANDS MEDICAL CENTRE OFFICIALLY OPEN



Oaklands first Medical Centre, opened officially on Friday, September 27, is dedicated to providing comprehensive health services to the community of Oaklands and surrounds.

Local GP, Dr Veerendra Yaramati, (Dr Giri) and his dedicated staff will be operating the centre under lease from Federation Council. Dr Giri and his team have operated the Urana Medical Centre very successfully for over 12 years and they are now looking forward to expanding their great services to the Oaklands Medical Centre.

The project involved extensively upgrading the former dwelling to convert it to an accredited Medical Centre, designed by Regional Design Service Corowa, with the construction work delivered by Kennedy Builders Mulwala, and project managed by Council.

Federation Council General Manager, Adrian Butler officiated the opening, alongside Dr Giri which saw over 50 people come together at the Medical Centre in Hunter Street, Oaklands to celebrate the occasion.

“To get to where we are today is testament to the patience, resilience and determination of Dr Giri,” Mr Butler said.

“Dr Giri is insisting the new Medical

Centre is a Council and community project, and that is correct to a point for the physical building, but as we know, a Medical Centre without a Dr and fabulous staff, is nothing but a building. To be standing here with a fully accredited Medical Centre, ready for business, is indeed a proud day for us all.”

Dr Giri has been the sole GP based at the the Urana Medical Centre for over 12 years, serving a broad reach of patients from as far afield as Naranderra, Lockhart, Rand, Balldale, Jerilderie, Corowa and many other places in between and further afield.

The total funding provided by the NSW State Government for the project was \$640,107 for the capital works and purchase, and a further \$83,349 for equipment. Significant in kind funding was also provided by Council in staff support since then to continue to ensure the building meets requirements.

TRANSFORMING WAX & FLAMES INTO ART: ‘FUSED’ EXHIBITION

Beeswax, a blowtorch and damar resin are the unlikely ingredients that form the basis of Sharon De Valentin’s upcoming solo exhibition ‘Fused’, which is exclusive to Corowa Art Space. ‘Fused’ explores the rugged beauty of banksias, the majesty of native gums, and the lively presence of magpies. Delicate roses, vast landscapes, and intricate stag head sculptures are complemented by small works crafted from found seeds, nuts, and papier-mâché clay.

FEDERATION COUNCIL 2024 ELECTION RESULTS OFFICIALLY DECLARED

Councillors have been declared by the NSW Electoral Commission for the Federation Council Local Government Area following the Local Government elections held on 14 September 2024.

The successful candidates were declared on Tuesday, 1 October at 11.45am at the returning office at Oddfellows Hall, in Sanger Street Corowa.

Federation Council General Manager Adrian Butler said Councillors will be officially sworn in to their roles at the first Council meeting to be held on Tuesday, October 15 at 9.30am at the Corowa Civic Centre.

“Councillors are required to make the Oath or Affirmation of Office at or before the first meeting or Council in accordance with Section 233A of the Local Government Act 1993,” he said.

“For Federation Council this will be at the first meeting on the 15th. In addition to the oath or affirmation being undertaken, a Mayoral election will also be conducted as required at this meeting. Should Council resolve under Section 233A to elect a Deputy Mayor, (not compulsory),

they will also do this at the meeting.”

Mr Butler said Council will also consider under Section 291A, if they wish to use the countback method to fill any Councillor vacancies should they occur in the first 18 months of Council.

“I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the new Councillors, those newly elected and those returning, and welcome them to Council,” he said.

“I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all of the unsuccessful candidates who stood, including those former Councillors who were not successful in the election. Thank you for your service to Council across past terms. RESPONSIBILITIES OF PET OWNERS



Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals. Residents are reminded of the responsibilities of pet owners to ensure the safety of companion animals and the community.

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area.
 - If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
 - You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
 - Just like all breeds of dogs in NSW, greyhounds will still be required to be on a leash while in public at all times.
 - If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area.
- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off-leash area it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
 - You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
 - Just like all breeds of dogs in NSW, greyhounds will still be required to be on a leash while in public at all times.
 - A greyhound will still require a muzzle in an off-leash area if it has not undergone an approved retraining program. Greyhounds that have completed this program will continue to wear identifying green collars, or, alternatively the person in charge of the animal can carry a completion card.
 - If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
 - Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, child care centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.

Federation Council will undertake an independent quantitative Community Satisfaction Survey project. APPLICATIONS OPEN FOR RIVERINA WATER'S \$100,000 ENRICHING COMMUNITIES

Riverina Water is once again offering \$100,000 in funding for projects that enhance the social, cultural, and environmental life for people within their supply area.

Applications are open for Riverina Water's Enriching Communities grants program, with eligible groups, clubs and organisations able to apply for a maximum \$20,000 each.

Riverina Water has held four previous grants programs under different formats, making a variety of projects possible such as upgrades to community facilities, sporting infrastructure, multicultural art projects and First Nations programs. Last year's Enriching Communities grant round saw funding awarded to groups such as Riding for the Disabled Wagga, Holbrook Meals on Wheels, the Lockhart Historical Society, and the Oaklands Memorial Hall.

The Enriching Communities funding allocations for each Council in Riverina Water's supply area are \$40,000 for Wagga Wagga City Council, and \$20,000 each for Lockhart Shire, Greater Hume and Federation.

BROADLEAF WEED SPRAYING

Selective Broadleaf weed spraying is scheduled to occur from September 2024 to October 2024. The application will occur in turf situations that include ovals, parks, cemeteries and open spaces to selectively remove weeds across the Federation Council. The herbicide that will be used is Javelin (20 g/l Clopyralid, 15 g/l Diflufenican, 300 g/l MCPA) This process is undertaken to improve the turf quality and reduce mowing frequencies.

Do you know bladder cancer is one of the most common cancer types? Many types of bladder cancer are highly treatable. Smoking is the most important risk factor in developing bladder cancer. The most telling sign is blood in urine. Men are 3 times more likely than women to be diagnosed. Although, survival rates for women are slightly lower than that for men. Not to be confused with a urinary tract infection. A cancer urologist will perform a cystoscopy for a diagnosis. No test so patients have to spot the troubling signs themselves!

URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.

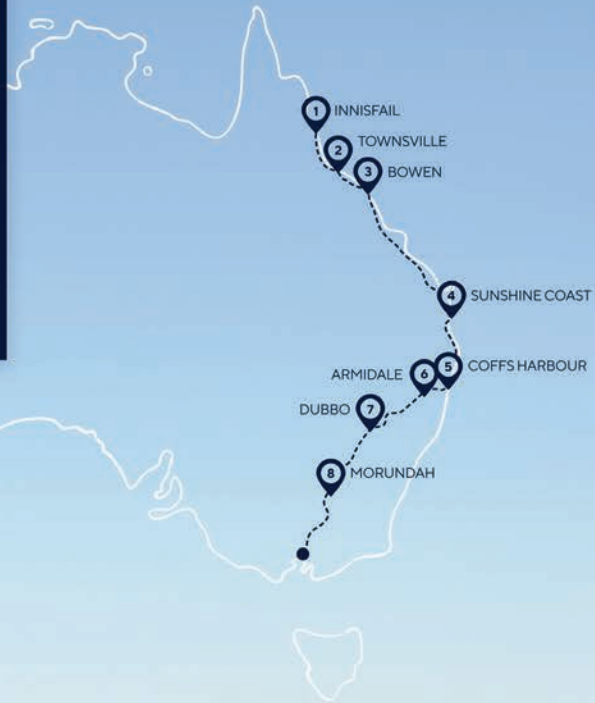
