

Our Mulwala Wall Art

68 Sanger St, Corowa

The Murray River spans the wall Corowa's Sanger Street. The artwork incorporates smaller individualised artworks created by local artists, school children and community groups.

Apex Park, 7 Inglis St, Mulwala

This spray painted mural depicts Nanna Mary a local midwife who helped many local mothers during the late 1800's and the White Bellied Sea Eagle known by the traditional owners of the land as Mulwala.

71 Melbourne St, Mulwala

The Our Mulwala Wall Art is an installation erected on the external wall of the Mulwala Council Office and Library incorporates cultural and historical photographs of Mulwala etched into aluminium to create a unique way to display history. The artwork is a joint project between the Mulwala Library History Group and the Federation Council.

Our largest towns of Mulwala, Corowa and Howlong run west to east along the northern bank of the Murray River.
